Palmer married a girl from Greece while he was in Cairo, Egypt, during World War II. Her name was Penelope. He brought her and their oldest son to Dad's home several times before he was killed in an accident **</Silas Palmer> <09>** in Washington DC I think it was at Christmas 1946 – not long before Granddad Steve passed away. Palmer was brought back here and buried in the family cemetery but I don't think they ever told his father. His wife took their 2 children and went to England where her mother lived. She later went to Singapore, Malaya, to visit some **<drowned>** relatives and was drowned when the boat she was on sank. I **</09>** think about 200 people were killed in the accident. The younger boy died later on. The oldest boy, Augustus Palmer, was raised by his step grandfather. He joined the U.S. Army – came and spent a furlough with Aunt Draxie. He came over to my house for a Sunday dinner. I don't think any of the family has heard from him since he left, and that has been about 9 years ago. **</drowned>**

<10> That about sums up the Osborne side but I want to briefly fill you in on Solomon Osborne's wife, Hannah Bolling. Through her, the line goes back to 1516. You meet up with Pocahontas – the Indian girl that saved Captain John Smith's life. Your children or grandchildren may want to use this if they have to make a family tree in school. My sister, Etta, has 2 great granddaughters – they can trace back 17 generations.
